

INTERNATIONAL CORPORATE AND BUSINESS LAW

Department: Civil and Arbitration Procedure

Course objective:

To form a legal science-based view of the world, to acquire the skills needed to examine the legal cases when implementing the provisions of the international corporate and financial law.

Course description:

Corporate and Business Law is divided into eight areas. The syllabus starts with an introduction to the overall legal system of the Russian Federation such as the sources of law and the court system. It then leads into the area of the law of obligations including contract and tort, which underpin entrepreneurial activity and business transactions generally. These are the law relating to employment and the law relating to companies. These laws include the formation and constitution of companies, the financing of companies and types of capital, and the day-to-day management, the administration and regulation of companies and legal aspects of companies facing difficulty or in crisis. A range of specific legal areas relating to various aspects of international business of most concern to finance professionals will be covered (the law relating to the financing of international transactions, and the various legal forms through which international business transactions may be conducted). The final section links back to all the previous areas. This section deals with corporate governance, ethics and ethical behavior relating to businesses, including criminal law.

The course learning objectives: to develop knowledge and skills in the understanding of the general legal framework within which international business takes place, and of specific legal areas relating to business.
