The course goal

To identify the legal basis for economic relations formation taking into account law development trends.

The course objectives

1. To examine the economic relations structure;

2. To classify the sources of legal regulation of economic relations, to examine the relevant concepts and their types;

3. To classify the main objectives of government regulation of economic and business operations.

Key didactic units

1. The concept, content and subjects of economic operations and economic relations; 2. Legal regulation of economic operations; 3. The Russian Federation as a state and its constituent territories as participants of economic operations; 4. Municipalities as subjects of economic operations; 5. Individuals (physical entities) as subjects of economic operations; 6. Legal entities as subjects of economic operations; 7. Legal basis of the economic, tax, fiscal, banking and monetary system of the Russian state; 8. Government regulation and control of economic operations; 9. Protection of the rights of subjects of economic operations and responsibility for violation of the rights.

Place of the discipline within the curriculum

The course is part of the social and humanities module of the core part of the curriculum of program 38.03.01 in Economics.

Upon completing the course, the students should:

Know: the legal norms of the laws governing relations in various sectors; Be able to: use legal norms to develop solutions to a specific problem; Have: the skills of choosing the best method of law application based on the existing legal norms and available resources and limitations.
